Some Key Current Info-Bits at Random (Nov. 21- Nov.30)

- The 44th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) was recently held at Panjim
 - Bhartiya Cinema Ka Safarnaama published by Directorate of publications Division was released at IFFI.
 - Czech filmmaker Jiri Menzel was given the Lifetime Achievement Award by the IFFI.
- On November 21, 2013 speaking at the BRICS International Competition Conference, PM Dr Singh called for giving public sector firms greater functional autonomy and freeing them from bureaucratic control and not in tolerating a slip in their competitiveness and then shielding them from competition.
 - o BRICS is a block of Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa.
 - BRICS countries have a combined population of three billion with a total GDP of nearly \$14 trillion and around \$4 trillion of forex reserves.
 - The grouping BRICS was originally known as "BRIC" before the inclusion of South Africa in 2010.
- On the margins of the Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) in Gurgaon, Japanese Foreign
 Minister Fumio Kishida reassured External Affairs Minister Salman Khurshid of its
 commitment to a bilateral civil nuclear deal.
 - ASEM was officially established in 1996.
 - The 11th ASEM Foreign Ministers' Meeting was held on 11/12 November 2013 at New Delhi, India
- **Chand Lal-Sarin**, first Indian-origin woman magistrate in Britain died in Coventry at the age of 84.
 - Myanmar- Born, Chand Lal-Sarin had moved to the UK from Punjab in 1962 and in 1970 she became a magistrate.
- Liechtenstein, Isle of Man, British Virgin Islands and Cayman Islands have recently joined the global convention formulated by the Paris-based advisory group OECD.
 - It is seen as a big boost in the fight against black-money.
 - The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) is an international economic organisation of 34 countries.
 - o OECD was founded in 1961.
- With a goal-less draw against Jordan in the return leg of their play-off at the Centenario stadium Montevideo, on November 21, 2013 Uruguay became the last team to qualify for the 2014 World Cup.
 - Oscar Tabarez is Uruguay coach.

- Recently Kohli completed 5000 ODI runs in his 114th innings, equalling Viv Richards' record as the fastest batsman in ODIs to 5000 runs.
 - o For India, Sourav Ganguly had 5000 ODI runs in 126 innings.
 - Kohli has won five Man-of-the-Match awards in ODIs in 2013, the most by any batsman this year. Ravindra Jadeja has become the leading wicket-taker in ODIs in 2013 going ahead of Saeed Ajmal.
- **Serena Williams** has recently won the WTA player of the year award for the second year running and the fifth time overall.
 - Williams has enjoyed one of the greatest seasons in WTA history.
 - She won 78 of 82 matches, the U.S. Open and French Open among 11 titles, and a record \$12,385,572 in prize money.
 - Since February, she's been the oldest No. 1 in WTA history.
- Recently at Chennai, after a hard-fought draw in the 10th game of the World Chess Championship match, five-time title-holder Viswanathan Anand lost to Magnus Carlsen, 23, of Norway.
 - Newly-crowned world chess champion Magnus Carlsen won a prize money of Rs 9.90 cr.
 - Anand had won the world championship title five times -2000, 2007, 2008, 2010,
 2012, ... ironically he was dethroned in his home town (Chennai).
 - This was the only time that **Anand failed to win a single game** in a world championship match.
 - Starting with his journey in 1991, Anand had always scored at least one victory in each of the match that he played in the last 22 years
 - o Carlsen (born on 30 November 1990) is **No. 1 ranked player** in the world.
 - o Carlsen was the 2009 World Blitz chess champion.
 - Carlsen became a grandmaster at the age of 13 years, 148 days, making him at that time the second youngest grandmaster in history, although he has since become the third youngest.
 - On 1 January 2010, at the age of 19 years, 32 days, he became the youngest chess player in history to be ranked world No. 1.
- On November 22, 2013 Indian-origin British MP Priti Patel was honoured with the prestigious Asian Trader Editors Award for her tireless campaigning to support small shops and convenience stores.
- On November 22, 2013 prominent Indian-Americans author **Salman Rushdie and filmmaker Mira Nai**r, were honoured by Indo-American Arts Council (IAAC).

- On November 23, 2013 Chief Justice of India Justice P Sathasivam inaugurated the first National Lok Adalat at New Delhi. The Lok Adalat held across India disposed of a record 30 lakh cases covering cheque bounce, civil suits, motor accident claims and service and family matters.
 - With this, the number of pending cases (estimated at over 30 million) in India has come down by about 10 per cent.
 - The National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) had organised the exercise through state and district-level legal services authorities.
 - Maharashtra managed to reduce the number of pending cases by 5.66 lakh, followed by Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal with 4 lakh cases each.
 - Delhi brought down the pendency by 3 lakh cases, including about 100 in the Supreme Court.
- On November 23, 2013 East China Sea Air Defence Identification Zone, established by China over disputed islands (called Diaoyu by China and Senkakus by Japan), became operations.
- On November 23, 2013 India successfully test-fired its **nuclear-capable surface-to-surface Dhanus**h ballistic missile from a naval ship off Odisha coast.
 - The surface-to-surface Dhanush is a naval variant of India's indigenously developed 'Prithvi' missile.
 - Dhanush missile is capable of carrying conventional as well as nuclear payload of 500 to 1,000 kg and hit both land and sea-based targets.
- On November 24, 2013 Iran and six world powers meeting in Geneva reached a deal that temporarily freezes **Tehrans nuclear programme** and marks a historic first step toward a more permanent agreement.
 - The deal was announced in Geneva where officials from Iran and the P5+1 the US, Britain, Russia, France, China and Germany along with the European Union, held intensive negotiations.
 - Iran has committed to halt uranium enrichment above 5 per cent, which is sufficient for energy production but not for making a bomb.
 - o Further, it will:
 - neutralise its stockpile of near-20 per cent enriched uranium;
 - halt progress on its enrichment capacity;
 - make no further advances of its activities at the Arak reactor;
 - halt work at its plutonium reactor; and
 - give International Atomic Energy Agency inspectors daily access to monitor its nuclear facilities at Natanz and Fordow.

- On November 24, 2014 an **Afghan grand assembly** endorsed a crucial security agreement allowing some US troops to stay on after 2014.
 - The assembly urged President Hamid Karzai to sign by the end of the year the Bilateral Security Agreement governing the presence of the troops after 2014, the date for most NATO combat forces to pull out.
 - The 50 groups making up the "loya jirga" gathering of about 2,500 chieftains, tribal elders and politicians.
- **Scotland has set March 24, 2016** as its independence day, if voters back leaving the UK in a "landmark" referendum to break up the 300-year union.
- On November 24, 2014 Ireland secured qualification for next years World Twenty20 by extending their unbeaten record in Group A of the qualifiers with a win over Hong Kong.
- Recently Ghaziabad CBI court convicted Talwar-couple of murdering their daughter and Nepalese domestic help. The two were held guilty under IPC's Sections:
 - o 302 (murder),
 - o 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention) and
 - 201 (causing disappearance of evidence)
 - Rajesh Talwar was also held guilty under Section 203 of the IPC for lodging a false FIR.
- On November 25, 2013 first unit of the 1,980-MW Talwandi Sabo Thermal Plant became operational at Banawala village.. was commissioned by Dy CM Sukhbir Singh Badal by pressing a remote button.
- On November 26, 2013 in Pakistan, PM Nawaz Sharif laid the foundation stone for a **2200-MW nuclear power plant in Karachi**, .. to be built with Chinese help.
- On November 26, 2013 Bangalore-based pharmaceutical company Biocon Ltd, announced that it has received approval from the Drugs Controller General of India to market its biosimilar trastuzumab developed jointly with Mylan for treatment of breast cancer.
 - o Biocon Limited is headed by a woman entrepreneur **Kiran Mazumdar Shaw**.
- Archaeologists from UK have suggested that the **sage Buddha** may have lived in the 6th century BC, two centuries earlier than thought.
 - Suggestion came from excavations within the sacred Maya Devi Temple at Lumbini in Nepal, a UNESCO World Heritage site long identified as the birthplace of the Buddha.
- On November 21, 2013 Vigilance and Anti-Corruption Bureau registered an FIR in a forgery case involving the high-end housing project at Kanlog. The FIR has been registered under IPC Sections:

- o 420 (cheating),
- o 465 (punishment for forgery),
- o 467 (forgery of valuable security, will, etc),
- o 468 (forgery for purpose of cheating),
- o 471 (using as genuine a forged document) and
- 120 (concealing design to commit offence punishable with imprisonment) of the IPC, and
- Section 33 (to set fire to forest without taking all reasonable precautions to prevent it from spreading) of the Indian Forest Act.
