## Some Key Current Info-Bits at Random (February 15- February 28)

- On February 15, 2014 Salman Khurshid jointly with President Hamid Karzai inaugurated Afghanistan National Agricultural Sciences and Technology University (ANASTU) in Kandahar.
  - The university has been set up with India's assistance on the site of the erstwhile headquarters of the Taliban.
- On February 16, 2014 Indian Tricolour was hoisted at the Sochi Games Village. Newlyelected Indian Olympic Association president N Ramachandran was also present at the ceremony in Rosa Khutor.
  - Shiva Keshavan, Himanshu Thakur and Nadeem Iqbal took part in the opening ceremony on February 7 under the IOC flag as they entered the Games as Independent Olympic Participants.
    - But after the IOC lifted the suspension on IOA following an election last week, they walked under the Tricolour at the closing ceremony.
- On February 16, 2014 Shot putter **Om Prakash Singh Karhana** gave India the lone gold in the 6th Asian Indoor Athletics Championships at Hangzhou, China.
  - o Om Prakash holds the outdoor national record at 20.69m.
  - He had won a silver medal in the India-dominated 2008 edition at Doha, Qatar.
- On February 17, 2014 President Pranab Mukherjee approved a resolution imposing the Centre rule in the National Capital Territory of Delhi on the advice of the Union Cabinet, after Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal resigned on February 14
- On February 17, 2014 for the first time in several years, the Supreme Court got its full sanctioned strength of 31 judges, including the Chief Justice of India, with Justices Rajesh Kumar Agarwal and Nuthalapati V Ramana assuming office.
  - o Chief Justice of India is P Sathasivam.
  - The present full strength, the number of SC judges is set for a drastic fall this year as ten judges are due for retirement.
- On February 17, 2014 in Italy, Matteo Renzi was nominated European Union youngest PM and immediately outlined an ambitious reform plan, promising "energy, enthusiasm and commitment" to revitalise the Eurozones third largest economy.
- On February 17, 2014 slavery drama "12 Years A Slave" of British director Steve McQueen won two of the biggest awards at the **BAFTA 2014**.
  - 3D space film "Gravity" of Alfonso Cuaron dominated the ceremony by taking home six trophies.
- On February 17, 2014 Union Finance Minister, while presenting the interim budget for the year 2014-15, said . .government has accepted the principle of one rank-one pension for the defence forces.
  - At present, there are two groups of the retirees the ones who retired before January 1, 2006 and the ones who retired after this date.
- On February 18, 2014 at Wellington, India ended ignominious tour of New Zealand by drawing 2nd Test.
  - o Brendon McCullum became first Kiwi batsman to hit a triple-century.

- On February 18, 2014 Lok Sabha approved carving out of **Telangana**, which after the Rajya Sabha nod will become the 29th state of the country.
- On February 19, 2014 Supreme Court upheld the legal provision for adoption of children under the **Juvenile Justice Act** (JJ Act) irrespective of their religion, caste or creed, holding that personal laws of Muslims and others could not stop this.
- In February 2014, **Bharti Airtel**, India's biggest mobile service company, became the first in the country to cross 200 million subscribers.
  - Airtel got its first permits for mobile telephony in November 1994 and started services in 1995.
- Recently **Mark Zuckerberg-led Facebook** revealed plans to II acquire popular mobile messaging service WhatsApp for \$19 billion.
- Recently, at Jamaica's **Sabina Park**. Ireland added to their list of giant-killing victories with a six-wicket win over World Twenty20 champions West Indies in the first T20 international.
- On February 20, 2014 Union Cabinet gave its go-ahead for setting up an independent coal regulator to infuse transparency and efficiency in the coal sector.
- On February 20, 2014 Iran and Britain **officially resumed diplomatic relations** severed by London after students stormed its Tehran embassy in 2011.
- On February 21, 2014 Election Commission of India issued guidelines to political parties, asking them to stick to rational promises in their manifestos and not to add anything that is repugnant to the ideals and principles enshrined in the Constitution.
- On February 21, 2014 Parliament passed the Whistleblowers' Protection Bill, with the Rajya Sabha giving its nod to the landmark legislation on the last day of the last parliamentary session of the UPA-II government.
- On February 21, 2014 **Uday Kotak**, executive vice-chairman, Kotak Mahindra Bank, was named the E&Y Entrepreneur of The Year 2013.
- On February 22, 2014 **Narayana Murthy** Infosys founder and executive chairman Narayana Murthy laid foundation stone of the campus at Mohali.
  - The same day, Narayana Murthy also laid the foundation stone of the biggest Infosys campus in the country at Nagpur.
- On February 22, 2014 US Secretary of State John Kerry named **Sarah Sewall**, the undersecretary of state for civilian security, democracy and human rights, to also serve as special coordinator for Tibetan issues.
- On February 22, 2014 CAG of India won the fifth edition of the BCCI Corporate Tournament to lift the **Raj Singh Dungarpur Trophy** by defeating defending champions Chemplast by 32 runs in the final at the Wankhede Stadium.
- On February 23, 2014 at Sydney, Worlds top 20 nations pledged to boost global growth by 2 pc, or over USD 2 trillion, over five years, and agreed to work on automatic tax information flow and IMF reforms, meeting key demands of India.

- On February 23, 2014 top singles star of India **Somdev Devvarman** lifted his third ATP Challenge title as he outclassed top seed Aleksandr Nedovyesov 6-3 6-1 in the final of the \$100,000 ONGC-GAIL Open at New Delhi.
- On February 23, 2014 at Ranchi, Delhi Waveriders defeated Punjab Warriors in a penalty shoot-out to emerge as the champions in the second edition of Hockey India League at the packed Astroturf Hockey Stadium.
- On February 24, 2014 in Uganda, **president Yoweri Museveni** signed a new law imposing harsh penalties on gay people.
- On February 24, 2014 India and China decided to expand their military ties during the **sixth Annual Defence and Security Dialogue**.
- On February 24, 2014 **India and Canada** signed three MoUs for cooperation in health sector, audio-visual co-production and skill development.
  - The MoUs were signed after talks between PM Dr Singh and visiting Governor General of Canada David Johnston.
- On February 25, 2014 Supreme Court observed that fatwas or the decisions of religious clerics could not be termed illegal unless these were sought to be enforced forcibly, while the government and the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) maintained that fatwas were mere opinions and not binding.
- On February 25, 2014 a three-judge Bench of the Supreme Court found fault with a verdict
  of a division Bench in 2011 allowing "passive euthanasia" by gradually withdrawing life
  supporting systems provided to suffering patients who had no chance of recovery.
  - The 2011 judgment, delivered in a case pertaining to a rape victim lying in coma for nearly 30 years in a Mumbai hospital, was based on a misinterpretation of a 1996 verdict (Gian Kaur vs State of Punjab) of a Constitution Bench.
    - The SC verdict came on a PIL filed by **NGO Common Cause in 2005**, pleading for a declaration that the right to die with dignity was a fundamental right within the fold of the "right to live with dignity" guaranteed under Article 21 of the Constitution.
- Sangeeta Bhatia, an Indian- American scientist at the MIT reported having developed a simple, cheap, paper test that could improve cancer diagnosis rates and help people get treated earlier.
- On February 25, 2014 Media Development Investment Fund (MDIF) shared that a US company is planning to build an "Outernet a global network of cube satellites broadcasting Internet data to all the people on the planet for free.
- On February 26, 2014 research firm IDC shared that **Smartphone sales** in India has grown almost three-fold to over 44 million in 2013
- On February 26, 2014 benchmark BSE Sensex breached the 21,000-mark after a month, but settled the day a tad lower at 20,986.99, a gain of 135 points, amid mixed trends from global markets.

- On February 27, 2014 in China, national legislature ratified a move to declare September 3
  as a national day to mark its victory over Japan in WWII, amid spiralling tensions with Tokyo
  over disputed islands in the East China Sea.
- On February 21, 2014 Ukraine Opposition leaders signed an EU-mediated peace deal with President Viktor Yanukovich, aiming to end a violent standoff that has left dozens dead and opening the way for a early presidential election this year.
  - On February 22, 2014 Ukrainian parliament voted to remove embattled President
     Viktor Yanukovych from office after protesters took control of capital of the country
  - On February 23, 2014 Parliament handed his powers temporarily to Oleksander Turchinov, who was elected speaker
  - On February 26, 2014 President Vladimir Putin put Russian combat troops on high alert for war games near Ukraine
  - On February 27, 2014 Russia granted protection to the fugitive Ukrainian president, .. as dozens of heavily armed gunmen seized control of government buildings in Crimea region in Ukraine and raised the Russian flag.
