 - o Earlier in November 2014, during the 18th SAARC Summit, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Nepal's Prime Minister Sushil Koirala jointly launched the direct bus service between Kathmandu and New Delhi.

• Union Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers launches Pharma Jan Samadhan scheme

- o It is a web enabled system for redressal of consumer's grievances relating to pricing and availability of medicines created by National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority (NPPA).
- o The scheme will put in place a speedy and effective complaint *redressal system* with respect to availability and pricing of medicines.
- o It will serve as a robust e-governance tool for protection of consumers' *interests* through effective implementation of the Drugs (Price Control) Order, 2013.
- o It will provide consumers with an on-line facility to redress their complaints relating to over-pricing of medicines, non-availability or shortage of medicines, sale of new medicines without prior price approval of NPPA, and refusal of supply for sale of any medicine without good and sufficient reason.
 - Once the complaint is redressed, NPPA will initiate action on the complaint within 48 hours of its receipt.

RBI, Sri Lankan central bank agrees on currency swap deal

- o Reserve Bank of India has agreed for a \$1.5-billion currency swap agreement with the Sri Lankan central bank to help the island nation keep its currency stable. At the current valuation, one Indian rupee is equivalent to 2.12 Sri Lankan rupees.
 - It has lost almost three per cent value in comparison to the Indian rupee so far in 2015.

 - o Dr. Alka is Scientific Director, National Dope Testing Laboratory, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.
 - Her tenure on the Executive Board of WAADS will be for a period of three years from March 2015.
 - The WAADS is an organization comprising anti-doping scientists from all the WADA accredited labs across the world.
- **UK to join China backed Asian Development Bank**
 - o Britain has sought to become a founding member of the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB), making it the first Western nation to embrace the China-backed institution.
 - o The AIIB was launched in Beijing last year to spur transportation, energy, telecommunication and other investment.
