## MOCK TEST NOTIFICATION

### UGC – NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY TEST (NET)

**Date of Test: 21.11.2010**

**Last Date for application: 29.10.2010**

1) Panjab University is going to hold Mock Test for UGC-NET (Humanities) on **21<sup>st</sup> November, 2010.**

#### **2) CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY:**

i) Candidates who have secured at least 55% marks (without rounding off) in Master's Degree **OR** equivalent examination from universities/ institutions recognized by UGC in Humanities is eligible for this Test. The Scheduled Caste (SC) / Schedule Tribe (ST)/ Physically Handicapped (PH)/ Visually Handicapped (VH) category candidates who have secured at least 50% marks (without rounding off) in Master's degree or equivalent examination are eligible for this Test.

(ii) Candidates who have appeared **OR** will be appearing at the qualifying Master's degree (final year) examination and whose result is still awaited **OR** candidates whose qualifying examinations have been delayed may also apply for this Test.

#### **3. EXAMINATION FEE:**

The examination fee for the Mock Test would be Rs.100/- for the students studying at Panjab University during the session 2010-11 and Rs.250/- for others.

#### **4. SCHEME AND DATE OF TEST:**

i) The Test will consist of three papers. All the three papers will be held on 21<sup>st</sup> November, 2010 in two separate sessions as under:

Session	Paper	Marks	Duration
First	I	100	1¼ Hours (9.30 A.M. to 10.45 A.M.)
First	II	100	1¼ Hours (10.45 A.M. to 12.00 Noon)
Second	III	200	2½ Hours (1.30 P.M. to 4.00 P.M.)

**Paper-I** shall be of general nature, intended to assess the teaching/ research aptitude of the candidate. It will primarily be designed to test reasoning ability, comprehension, divergent thinking and general awareness of the candidate. UGC has decided to provide choice to the candidates from the December 2009 UGC-NET onwards. Sixty (60) multiple choice questions of two marks each will be given, out of which the candidate would be required to answer any fifty (50). In the event of the candidate attempting more than fifty questions, the first fifty questions attempted by the candidate would be evaluated.

**Paper-II** shall consist of questions based on the subject selected by the candidate. Each of these papers will consist of a Test Booklet containing

50 compulsory objective type questions of two marks each.

The candidate will have to mark the response for question of Paper-I and Paper-II on the Optical Mark Reader (OMR) sheet provided alongwith the Test Booklet.

**Paper-III** will consist of only descriptive questions from the subject selected by the candidate.

The candidate will be required to attempt questions in the space provided in the Test Booklet. The structure of Paper-III has been revised from June, 2010 UGC-NET which is as follows:

**Section-I:** Essay writing – two questions with internal choice on general themes and contemporary, theoretical or of disciplinary relevance may be given. The candidate is expected to write upto 500 words for each question of 20 marks (2Qx20M=40 Marks). In case the questions are based on electives, the choices should have questions from each elective; otherwise all choices should be of general nature, common to all candidates. In case of science subjects like Computer Science and Applications, Environmental Sciences, Electronic Science etc., two questions carrying 20 marks each may be given in place of essay type questions. The questions in this section should be numbered as 1 and 2.

**Section-II:** Three extended answer based questions to test the analytical ability of the candidate are to be asked on the major specializations/electives. Questions will be asked on all major specializations/electives and the candidates may be asked to choose one specialization/elective and answer the three questions. There is to be no internal choice. Each question will be answered in upto 300 words and shall carry 15 marks each (3Qx15M=45 Marks). Where there is no specialization/elective, 3 questions may be set across the syllabus. The questions in this section should be numbered from 3 to 5.

**Section-III:** Nine questions may be asked across the syllabus. The questions will be definitional or seeking particular information and are to be answered in upto 50 words each. For science subjects as mentioned in Section-I, short numerical/computational problems may be considered. Each question will carry 10 marks (9Qx10M=90 Marks). There should be no internal choice. The questions in this section should be numbered from 6 to 14.

**Section-IV:** It requires candidates to answer questions from a given text of around 200-300 words taken from the works of a known thinker/author. Five carefully considered specific questions are to be asked on the given text, requiring an answer in upto 30 words each. This section carries 5 questions of 5 marks each (5Qx5M=25 Marks). In the case of science subjects, a theoretical/numerical problem may be set. These questions are meant to test critical thinking, ability to

comprehend and apply knowledge one possesses. Questions in this section should be numbered as 15 to 19.

**ii) There is no negative marking in Paper-I and Paper-II**

**iii) For Visually Handicapped (VH) candidates** thirty minutes' extra time shall be provided separately for paper-I and Paper-II. For Paper-III, forty five minutes' extra time shall be provided. They will also be provided the services of a scribe who would be a graduate in a subject other than that of the candidate. Those **Physically Handicapped (PH)** candidates who are not in a position to write in their own hand-writing can also avail these services by making prior request in writing along with the application form to the Coordinator of the test. Extra time and facility of scribe would not be provided to other Physically Handicapped candidates.

**iv) Syllabi of Test:** The syllabi for all NET subjects can be downloaded from the UGC website [www.ugc.ac.in](http://www.ugc.ac.in)

**v)** The test booklet for this Mock Test will be printed in Hindi & English only. The candidate will be supplied test booklet as per medium mentioned by him/her in column no.3 of the application form.

**vi)** In case of any discrepancy found in the English and Hindi versions, the questions in English version shall be taken as final.

#### **6. THE TEST CENTRES:**

The Mock Test would be conducted at the Panjab University Campus only. The candidates are advised to check Panjab University website [www.puchd.ac.in](http://www.puchd.ac.in) on or after **16.11.2010** for allotment of their test centre.

#### **7. HOW TO APPLY:**

(i) Prescribed application form, available from the Coordinator, UGC-NET Mock Test (Humanities) and website <http://puchd.ac.in>, should reach to the **Honorary Director, Centre for IAS and other Competitive Examinations, Panjab University, Chandigarh** along with requisite fee in cash or demand draft (in favour of Coordinator, UGC-NET 2010 (Humanities) by **29.10.2010 (Friday)** positively.

(ii) Applicants sending their applications through post may note that the envelope containing the Application Form be subscribed "UGC NET Mock Test in Humanities 2010."

(iii) The candidate must affix their recent identical passport size photographs, at the places indicated, in the Application Form and Admit Card.

(iv) In order to avoid last minute rush, the candidates are advised to apply early enough.

#### **8. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:**

(i) Candidate must bring his/her Admit Card at the Examination Centre failing which candidate will not be allowed to enter in the Examination Hall.

(ii) The Admit Card is non-transferable. No request for change of Examination Centre will be

entertained under any circumstances.

(iii) The answers of the questions are to be marked in the OMR Answer Sheet with **BLACK BALL POINT PEN ONLY**.

(v) Candidates should reach the Examination Centre at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time of conduct of the examination.

(vi) No candidate is allowed to enter the examination hall after schedule time of examination and also not allowed to leave the examination hall before completion of examination.

(vii) Candidate is strictly prohibited to carry electronic devices like calculator, cellular phone, pager, digital diary and log tables etc. in the examination hall.

(viii) A candidate who does not appear in paper-I, will not be permitted to appear in paper-II and paper-III.

(ix) Candidates who do not receive or have misplaced admit cards are advised to download application form from Panjab University website. They should paste passport size photograph on the admit card and bring photocopy of Bank Demand Draft / fee receipt on the day of examination (Check your Examination Centre from P.U. website on or after 16.11.2010). They should report, one hour before the commencement of the examination, to the Superintendent of the Test Centre. They will be issued duplicate admit card on production of identity proof (I-card / Driving Licence).
